

Chapter 4 – Academic Affairs

AP 4400 Community Services

Classes are established and maintained in civic, career/technical education, literacy, health, homemaking, and general education, including, but not limited to, classes in the fields of music, drama, art, handicraft, science, literature, nature study, nature contacting, aquatic sports, and athletics.

Classes are designed to provide instruction and to contribute to the physical, mental, moral, economic, or civic development of the individuals or groups enrolled in them.

Classes are open for the admission of adults and of those minors who may profit from the classes in the judgment of the Board of Trustees.

General fund moneys are not expended to establish and maintain community service classes.

Students enrolled in community service classes may be charged a fee not to exceed the cost of maintaining community service classes, or classes may be provided for remuneration by contract, or with contributions or donations of individuals or groups.
